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Rare Ovarian Cancer Inc. - ROC Inc. is a Not for profit organisation formed in 2018 in response to a Mother whose daughter was diagnosed at 16 years old with a rare ovarian cancer that had received no research.

ROC Inc vision is to create a greater awareness for ovarian cancer, it's symptoms and to ensure infants to women with rare ovarian cancer receive funded research for better options for treatment, intervention and prevention.

Granulosa Cell Tumour (GCT), a rare ovarian cancer that has two sub types adult -aGCT and juvenile jGCT.

These tumours arise due to the dysfunction of the granulosa cells inside the ovary and are different from the more common forms of ovarian cancers which stem from the surface of the ovary.

GCT accounts for approximately 8-10% of all ovarian cancers, affecting patients as young as infants to post-menopausal women.

GCT has an unexplained tendency for late recurrence which can be up to 40 years later.

The Hudson Institute of Medical Research located in Melbourne, Australia needs GCT tumour samples (both aGCT and jGCT) and DNA (saliva kit) samples to be able to do research, for better options for treatment, intervention and prevents.
